Documentation of confirmation numbers, upgrade requests, and applied points or credits is critical, especially for long multi-leg itineraries, as it ensures proper tracking and prevents misapplication of charges. Airlines may also provide notifications about available upgrades through email alerts, push notifications in the Air Canada mobile app, or through Aeroplan account updates, allowing proactive travelers to secure premium seating before flights fill.
